

Expectations of Bibliography and Citations

~Remember, we expect a minimum of 6 sources, 2 of which can be internet sources for the whole paper.

Refereed sources should follow the outline:

Author. Year. Title of Article. Journal **Volume**:pp.

Pay attention to where periods are placed and use of bold characteristic.

Example of single author article:

Turner, M. G. 1987. Effects of grazing by feral horses, clipping, trampling, and burning on a Georgia salt-marsh. *Estuaries* **10**:54-60.

Should be cited in paper as (Turner 1987) with period after citation if occurring at the end of a sentence.

Example of multi-author article:

Dormann, C. F., R. Van der Wal, and J. P. Bakker. 2000. Competition and herbivory during salt marsh succession: the importance of fob growth strategy. *Journal of Ecology* **88**:571-583.

Should be cited in paper as (Dormann et al. 2000).

Website sources (notice that complete publication information may not be available, please provide what is given):

Author. "Title of Web Page". Title of the Site. Editor. Date and/or Version Number. Name of Sponsoring Institution. Date of Access <URL>.

Again, pay attention to placement of periods, quotations and underlining.

Example of Website source:

Sherman, Chris. "Everything You Ever Wanted to Know About URL". SearchEngineWatch. Ed. Danny Sullivan. 24 Aug. 2004. 4 Sept. 2004 <http://searchenginewatch.com/searchday/article.php/335847>.

Should be cited in paper as (Sherman 2004).
